# EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 020 Series 2024

# AN ORDER REORGANIZING THE SOCIAL PROTECTION TEAM OF THE CITY OF IMUS, CAVITE

WHEREAS, social protection as defined in NEDA-Social Development Committee (SDC) through Resolution No. 1, Series of 2007 Constitutes policies and programs that seek to reduce poverty and vulnerability to risks and enhance the social status and rights of the marginalized by promoting and protecting livelihood and employment, protecting against hazards and sudden loss of income, and improving people's capacity to manage risks;

WHEREAS, Chapter 8 of the Philippine Development Plan (PDP) 2011-2016-Social Development considers social protection as one of the strategies to achieve the goal of reducing poverty and promoting inclusive growth and equitable access to quality basic social services, especially by the poor and vulnerable;

WHEREAS, by virtue of NEDA-SDC Resolution No. 3, Series of 2012, social protection operational framework and strategy was formulated and adopted;

whereas, Joint Memorandum Circular No. 01 of the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) and Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) dated 23 January 2015 enjoins all provinces, cities and municipalities to use Social Protection (SP) Handbook for local planning, budgeting, implementing, monitoring and evaluating social protection programs;

whereas, the Social Protection (SP) Handbook shall serve as the primary reference of local government unit (LGUs), civil society organizations (CSOs), and government agencies in implementing social protection programs and likewise become a useful tool for providing social protection lens in the regular course of planning, budgeting, implementing, monitoring and evaluating social protection programs at the local level;

**WHEREAS**, LGUs are directed to initiate, implement and monitor responsive and innovative social protection programs, strategies and initiatives that would reduce people's vulnerabilities and get them out of poverty;

WHEREAS, the changes in the administration necessitates the reorganization/reconstitution of the Social Protection Team of the City of Imus, Cavite;

Section 3. Roles and Functions- The various clusters shall perform the following roles and functions:

- 3.1 Convene all the members of the cluster;
- 3.2 Participate on the City workshop on social protection;
- 3.3 Assist in the conduct of the City/ Municipal/ Barangay workshop on social protection;
- 3.4 Consolidate the social protection assessments and plans with the purview of cluster; and
- 3.5 Prepare and submit reports to the proper agencies and authorities.

Section 4. Social Protection Risk, Vunerability and Adaptation Assessment- The City Development Council (CDC) shall be the body responsible in conducting the Social Protection Risk, Vulnerability and Adoption Assessment (SP-RVAA). It shall likewise perform the following functions:

- 4.1 Convene all the members of the expanded City Development for SP RVAA;
- 4.2 Conduct the City workshop on social protection;
- 4.3 Conduct the city/municipal/ barangay workshop on social protection;
- 4.4 Consolidate the social protection assessment and plans; and
- 4.5 Report the SP to the proper agencies and authorities.

Section 5. Secretariat- The City Social Welfare and Development Office shall act as the leader and secretariat for the activities of the CDC related to SP-RVAA.

Section 6. Assistant Secretariat- The City Planning and Development Office shall act as the assistant secretariat for the SP-RVAA concern.

- **Section 7. City Social Protection Workshop-** The City Development Council shall be responsible for organizing the conduct of workshop to determine and assess risk and vulnerabilities. The activities to be done are the following:
  - 7.1 Review of the city data risk and vulnerabilities from the secondary materials available in the LGU by cluster. These include the:
    - 7.1.1 Social Protection and Development Report;
    - 7.1.2 Socio- Economic Profile;
    - 7.1.3 Comprehensive Land Use Plan;
    - 7.1.4 Community-Based Monitoring System; and
    - 7.1.5 Sectoral Plan such as the City Development Plan for Children, Ancestral Domains Sustainable Development and Protection Plan, Gender and Development (GAD) Plan.
  - 7. 2 Review of the City hazards based on secondary materials and maps;
  - 7. 3 Identification of the risks per category as provided by the SPDR, if available, and enhanced by other data provided by other agencies and CSO members per cluster;
  - 7. 4 Identification of the adaptive strategies for disaster risk reduction. the adoptive strategy for risk reduction of service institutions contributes to the building of resilience among the affected vulnerable groups. These shall be taken by reviewing the programs and other services being done

- 7.4.1 Review of program documents;
- 7.4.2 Sharing within the cluster on program and service provided; and
- 7.4.3 Focus group discussion with the program key players.
- Preparation of the consolidated output namely the City Social Protection 7.5 RVAA based on secondary materials and documents composed of the following sections:
  - 7.5.1 An analysis of the hazards, vulnerability and risks per category; and
  - 7.5.2 An inventory of adaptation strategies per risk category.

Section 8. Repealing Clause- All executive issuances, orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof of inconsistent with the provision of the Executive Order are hereby repealed of modified accordingly.

Section 9. Separability Clause- Should any provision of this Executive Order be declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other section or provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 10. Effectivity- This Executive Order shall take effect immediately.
