Series of 2022

AN ORDER UPDATING THE CITY OF IMUS COVID-19 ACTION PLAN

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 151 (s.2021) issued by the President of the Philippines, on November 11, 2021, approved the national roll-out of the Alert Level System and adopted the guidelines as the guidelines to be implemented and enforced in all areas under the Alert Level System, in response to COVID-19 Pandemic.

WHEREAS, this is to replace the previous action plan Executive Order No. 45-A Series of 2020 "AN ORDER ADOPTING THE CITY OF IMUS COVID-19 ACTION PLAN".

WHEREAS, in compliance with the said order, the City Government of Imus adopts the IATF "GUIDELINES ON THE NATIONWIDE IMPLEMENTATION OF ALERT LEVEL SYSTEM FOR COVID-19 RESPONSE" issued last June 27, 2022, and issued additional interim guidelines.

WHEREAS, the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office and the City Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit under the City Health Office, formulated the City of Imus COVID-19 Action Plan to contain, prevent, and eliminate the threat of COVID-19.

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the power vested in me by law, I, **ALEX L. ADVINCULA**, Chairperson CDRRMC, City Mayor, City of Imus, Province of Cavite, do hereby order the updating of the City of Imus COVID-19 Action Plan, to wit:

Section 1. Priority Actions-

- 1. Funds must be readily available for six (6) months to sustain the government's efforts.
- Unhampered delivery of food products.
- Maintain mobilization of government resources to sustain operations.
- Continuous provision of essential services such as banks, telecommunication, power, water, and other critical facilities.
- Protection of front liners and ensuring enough supplies of personal protective equipment (PPE).



6. Information sharing particularly in the contact tracing process for Confirmed COVID-19 patients, Probable cases, and Suspect cases.

 - During alert level 1, isolation and quarantine of fully vaccinated COVID confirmed patients were reduced to 7 days and patients who are in close contact with the positive patient should not be required to undergo quarantine if the patient does not have any symptoms.
 - COVID confirmed patients with partial or no vaccination should undergo 10 days of quarantine and close contact with the same status should undergo 14 days of quarantine.

- Disseminate appropriate, accurate, and timely messages utilizing all available platforms;
- Manage "infodemics" (an excessive amount of information that hampers solution-identification) by ensuring a cohesive information campaign with that of TG STRATCOM;
- Address local "fake news" and other falsified information;
- Request school authorities, non-government and religious organizations, CSOs, and private sector groups for resource mobilization as force multipliers to disseminate accurate and timely messages;
- Implement measures to cultivate the adoption of desired public behavior.

Section 5. Operational Guidelines- To sustain COVID-19 Operations, line agencies are encouraged to organize their respective Incident Management Team (IMT) to perform the planning, organizing, staffing, directing, monitoring of response decisions, reporting development, tracking of checked-in resources, and implementation of higher management directives and the Responsible Officer shall ensure the safety of all personnel and logistical requirements and facilitate the complete demobilization process.



Section 6. Concept of Sustainment-

- In compliance with physical distancing, the CITY OF IMUS shall explore the information technology advancement in coordination and virtual conferences/meetings, information sharing, resource mapping, and tracking needed resources for response operations.
- Concerned City agencies and Barangays shall utilize their respective resources.
 However, when the response activities are beyond the capacity of the member
 agencies and the DRRMC, provision for additional requirements shall be
 coordinated through the IMUS CDRRMC.

Section 7. Inter-Agency Communication System Support-

- For the entire duration of the operations, the existing means of communications shall be utilized or whatever is applicable. However, the Emergency Telecommunication Cluster will be activated once communication is cut-off from the affected areas or when there is a need for additional resources for communication (personnel, technicians. communicators, etc.) based on the magnitude and scale of operations.
- The CDRRMC shall be the main repository of reports originating from member agencies and DRRMOs relative to their actions taken thereon. Likewise, CDRRMC EOC shall serve as the center for communication in collaboration with the MACC-PNP.
- CDRRMC Member Agencies and CDRRMO shall establish their respective Emergency Operations Center manned 24 hours to enable efficient communication to COVID-19 health efforts in the region and communities and shall provide timely reports on actions taken and COVID-19 surveillance efforts.

Section 8. Incident Command System- The structure of the Incident Command System shall be identified by the CDRRMC in a meeting to be held among its members and Barangays for its unification.



Section 9. Effectivity- This shall immediately take effect upon approval. **DONE** and **SIGNED** this 9th day of September 2022, City of Imus.
